“Sacred Documents: Researching Church Records”

This lecture covers the topic of church records, specifically Catholic Church records. Baptisms, Confirmations, First Communions, Marriage Investigations, Marriages, Sick Calls, Burials, Communion records, and Ecclesiastical Census records will all be discussed in detail. We will also learn key Latin phrases that appear in church records.

Anthony Ray is an avid genealogist who specializes in church records, California, Mexican, and Southwest research. He has been researching his own family for the past twelve years and has been a member of the Antelope Valley Genealogical Society, the Genealogical Society of Hispanic America, The Contra Costa Historical Society, and the Solano County Genealogical Society. While a member of the AVGS, he was publicity chairman and was head of the cemetery committee for several years. In 2011, Anthony was honored with being awarded the first Suzanne Winsor Freeman Student Genealogy Grant, which he used to further his research. He has done extensive research all throughout California, Arizona, and in the northern Mexican state of Sonora.
